Course Description

This compulsory History and Citizenship course is designed to promote greater understanding of the many social, ethnic, religious, economic, linguistic, and cultural facets that have shaped Quebec within its Canadian context. There will be teacher directed classes and assignments, but there will also be a strong emphasis on self-reflection and critical analysis. Through independent reading and writing, group work, and class discussions, it is hoped students will gain not only a greater understanding of the past, and how it is written, but also how our history shapes our present society, and our role within it. Moreover, students will cover the material chronologically in order to best understand the historical facts in relation to the present.

The two year History and Citizenship course is covered in Secondary 3 and 4 as required by the Ministry of Education and Loisirs (MELS). The MELS sets out the curriculum and students will be required to pass the June provincial exam in Secondary 4. Students must pass the course to graduate.
